MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, HELD DECEMBER 4th, 1934.

Be it remembered that on this the 4th day of December, A.D. 1934, there was begun and holden a regular meeting of the City Commission in and for the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the Municipal Office in said City with the following officers of the City present and presiding, to-wit:-

The following proceedings, were had, to-wit:-

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Minutes of meetings held in the month of November, 1934, were read and on motion duly made and carried were approved as read.

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Mrs. Eva Sharpe, Relief Administrator of the County of Angelina appeared before the City Commission and stated that there were some rents due the R.B. Shearer Estate for warehouse rent, and the arrangements should be made for warehouse facilities for future use by the Relief Administration. She also stated that there were some unpaid bills made on account of building slaughtering equipment for the slaugtering of animals to be canned by the Federal Canning Plant. She asked that the City pay the rents due the Shearer Estate and also to make provisions for warehouse space for future use from November 10th 1934 for such length of time as one is needed. She also asked that the

All these matters were thoroughly discussed, and it was unanimously decided that the Gity of Lufkin should not pay any rents that were contracted to be paid before November 10th, 1934. They, the Gity Gommissioners agreed to pay one-half of rents to be paid for ware-house facilities for Relief Administration so long as it was necessary from November 10th, 1934. to pay such rents, It was decided to figure on building a warehouse on property owned by the City on which the offices of the Relief Administration are now located. It was unanimously decided that none of the bills made for construction of slaughter pen would be paid by the City.

and it appearing that heretofore it had been agreed by the City Commission that the sum of \$100.00 would be paid for a years rent on such land, and it now appearing that Mrs. J.E. Berry had agreed to accept such amount as a years rent on said land for said purpose, Mr. Curtis W. Fenley was instructed to draw up lease covering the transaction and in accordance with said agreement, and that as soon as it was properly executed by Mrs. J.E. Berry, the City Secretary is authorized to issue warrant for the sum of \$100.00 payable to Mrs. Berry for said purpose.

Bills and accounts due by the fity to various parties, firms and corporations were presented for payment and it appearing that such of said bills as had been properly approved by the City Manager, should be paid, on motion duly made and carried there were allowed.

There being no further business to come before the meetings on motion duly made and carried, it adjourned.
