MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS.

November 2nd, 1920.

Be it remembered that on this the 2nd day of November, A. D. 1920, there was begun and holden a regular meeting of the Honorable Gity Commission of the Gity of Lufkin, Texas, at the Municipal Office thereof; Present and presiding the Hon. G. A. Kelley, Mayor, S. R. Parker, Gommissioner Ward No. 1, E. E. Woods, Commissioner of Ward No. 2, 20 R. Jenker, Gommissioner of Ward No. 3 and W. B. Treadwell, Commissioner of Ward No. 4, and T. L. Dunn, Acting City Manager and City Secretary, when the following proceedings were had, to-wit:-

Minutes of former meetings read to the City Commission, and and after move and second duly made and carried were adopted as read.

Acting Gity Manager T. L. Dunn, reported the resignation of V. E. Wilson as Night Marshall, and the appointment of B. F. Hartt as Night Marshall. By move and second duly made and carried, said appointment was confirmed by unanimous vote of the Gity Commission.

The Acting City Manager, T. L. Dunn, stated that in the appointment of B. F. Hartt as Night Marshall, the position of City Pound Master was vacant because of the fact that the said B. F. Hartt, had been City Pound Master, and he reported the appointment of J. M. Mills as City Pound Master. By move and second duly made and carried, said appointment was confirmed by unanimous vote of the City Commission.

The question of selecting a dity Manager was discussed by the City Commission, and after which E. E. Woods made a motion, S. R. Parker, seconding same, that Mayor G. A. Kelley, be empowered to negotiate for the employment of a City Manager. Said question having been stated by the Mayor, and instructed all members of the City Commission favoring said motion to vote "Aye" and those members opposing the passage of same to vote "No". All members voted "Aye" and the Mayor decalred said motion carried. -

An Ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE REGULATING THE CLEANING AND KEEPING CLEAN THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, BY ADDING THERE TO SECTION 35-A". Was presented to the City Commission for passage and approval in due form as an emergency, which said ordinance has to do with the washing and repairing of Automobiles and other motor vehicles on any paved street of alley in the City of Lufkin, Texas. Said ordinance was read to the City Commission, and E. E. Woods made a motion to pass and approve said ordinance, and that the rule requiring ordinances to be read at two stated meetings and not to become effective until ten days after passage and publication, be suspended, and that said ordinance be placed on second reading, and take effect and be in force from and after final passage and publication. W? B? Treadwell seconded said maximum motion, and mayor G. A. Kelley put the question, and requested all members who favored the passage of said ordinance to vote "Aye, and those members who opposed the passage of said ordinance to vote "No".S.R.Parker, E.E.Woods, B. L. Zeagler and W. B. Treadwell, voted "Aye". No votes were against the proposition, and the Mayor declared the motion carried and the ordinance passed and approved.

An ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE REGULARING SPEED OF MOTOR VEHICLES IN THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS", was presented in due form, and after reading same to the City Commission, it was moved by E. E. Woods to pass and approve said ordinance, and that the rule requiring ordinances to be read at two stated meetings and not to become effective until ten days after passage and publication, be suspended, and that said ordinance be placed on second reading, and take effect and be in

force from and after final passage and publication. B. L. Zeagler seconded said motion, and Mayor G. A. Kelley put the question, and requested all members favoring the passage of said ordinance to vote "Aye" and those members who opposed the passage of said ordinance to vote "No". S. H. Parker, E. E. Woods, W. B. Treadwell and B. L. Zeagler voted "Aye". No votes were cast against the proposition, and the Mayor declared the motion carred and the ordinance passaed and approved.

An ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE DEFINING CAMING AND AFFIXING PENALTIES THEREFOR", was presented in due form, and reading same to the City Commissioner, it was moved by R. E. Woods and to pass and approve said ordinance, and that the rule requiring ordinances to be read at two stated meetings and not to become effective until ten days after passage and publication, be suspended, and that said ordinance be placed on second reading, and take effect and be in force from and after final passage and publication. S. R. Parker seconded said motion, and Mayor G. A. Kelley put the question, and requested members favoring the passage of said ordinance to vote "Aye" and those members who opposed the passage of said ordinance to vote "No". S. R. Parker, E. E. Woods, W. B. Treadwell and B.L.Zeagler voted "Aye". No votes were against the proposition, and the Mayor declared the motion carried and the ordinance passaed and approved.

An ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE DEFINING VACRANCY AND AFFIXING PENALTY", was presented in due form, and after reading same to the City Commission, it was moved by S. R. Parker to pass and approve said ordinance and that the rule requiring ordinances to be read at two stated meetings and not to become effective until ten days after passage and publication, be suspended, and that said ordinace be placed on second reading, and take effect and be in force from and after final passage and publication. E. E. Woods seconded said motion, and G. A. Kelley put the question and requestion that all members of the City Commission who favored the passage of said ordinance to vote "Aye" and those who opposed the passage of said ordinance to vote "No". S. R. Parker, E. E. Woods, B. L. Zeagler and W.B. Treadwell, voted "Aye". No votes were against the propesition, and the Mayor declared the motion carried and the ordinance passed and approved.

An ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE DEFINING AFFRAY AND DISTURBANCES OF THE PEACE, AND AFFIXING PENALTIES THEREDOR", was presented in due form, and after reading the same to the City Commission, it was moved by B.L. Zeagler to pass and approve said ordinance and that the rule requiring ordinances to be read at two stated meetings and not to become effective until ten days after passage and publication, be suspended, and that said ordinance be placed on second reading, and take effect and be in force from and after final passage and publication. E. E. Woods seconded said motion, and Mayor G. A. Kelley put the question, and requested all members of the Gity Commission who favored the passage of said ordinance to vote "Aye", and those who opposed the passage of said ordinance to vote "No". S. R. Parker, E. E. Woods, B. L. Zeagler and W. B. Treadwell, voted "Aye". No votes were against the proposition, and the Mayor declared the motion carried, and the ordinance passaed and approved.

Accounts and bills due by the city to various partyes, firms and corporations, were presented for payment, and it appearing that same had been properly approved for payment by the Gity Manager, by move and second duly made and carried, payment was allowed, and the City Secretary ordered to write City Warrants in payment of same.

There being no further business to come before the Commission, by move and second duly made and carried, adjournment was taken.
