MINUTES OF THE CITY COUNCIL
CITY OF LUFKIN?
3/30th. 1916.

Be it known that pursuant to a call of Mayor Mantooth, the call being duly executed and filed here-with, there came on and was held a special called meeting of the City Council of the City on this the thirtieth day of March A.D. 1916 in the Chamber hall of said City, there being the following officers present.

The meeting was regularly opened by prayer by Mayor Mantooth invoking Divine assistance.

Mr. Chambers, representing the A. M. Lockett & Co. of Houston and New Orleans appeared before the Council with reference to the new pumping machinery and to arrange the financial end of the proposition. After considerable discussion it was agreed that Mr. Chambers would call on Mr. J. L. Arlitt of Austin, Texas and see if some agreement could not be arrived at by which the Machinery could be released and installed.


