

MINUTES OF Called MEETING OF THE CITY COMMISSION
OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, HELD June 30th
1943 AT 2:30 PM.

On this the 30th day of June, A. D. 1943, the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, convened in Called session, in the regular meeting place in said City, with the following members thereof, to-wit:

being present, and the following absent: Arthur Temple, Jr.
constituting a quorum when the following business was transacted:


1. Mayor Glenn announced the first matter for attention was a recommendation from the City Zoning Board.
 2. The written recommendation was presented, in which the Zoning Board recommended that the Zoning Ordinance ~~be~~ be amended by adding to Section 7 the permissive use to be entitled "Laundry".
 3. Also included in the recommendation was that the Zoning Map be amended so as to change from District "B" to District "M" the property bounded on the West by Chestnut Street, on the North by Lufkin Avenue, on the South by Kerr Avenue and on the East by Church Street.
 4. After some discussion motion was made by R.E. Melvin, second by B.F. Milligan and carried by all members voting yea, that the recommendation be approved and notice be published of a public hearing on the question to be held on July 16th at 2:30 P.M.
 5. Application of ~~SK~~, ~~Morris~~ was presented in which he requested a permit be granted for installation of an underground tank and pump for gasoline on the lot adjacent to the Union Taxi Cab Company between Spumlock Drug Store and Eat-A-Bite.
 6. Motion was made by R.E. Melvin, second by B.F. Milligan and carried by all members voting yea that permit be granted provided construction restrictions inside the fire limits were not violated.
 7. Mr. Kelley reported that he had contacted an engineer in Dallas on his recent trip who would make a survey of Lufkin's water situation for a fee of \$500.00 but after discussion it was concluded to not incur this expense at present but to have an analysis made of the two waters the City has and endeavor to find a treatment so the two can be used together successfully/

Matter of purchasing Government Bonds with the money realized from sale of old pump and motor from the water plant and from the Denman Avenue property, amounting to \$6,000.00 and motion was made by R.E. Melvin, second by Jas. A. Abney authorizing the purchase of \$6,000.00 in Series "G" Government War Bonds.

The motion carried by all members voting yea.

Nothing further was presented for attention and the meeting was adjourned.
