MINUTES OF A CALL MEETING
OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF
LUFKIN, TEXAS? HELD Apr. 22, 1935.

Be it remembered that on this the 22nd day of April, A.D. 1935, there was begun and holden a call meeting in and for the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the Municipal Office in said City with the following officers of the City present and presiding, to-wit:

The purpose of the meeting was stated to be to pass an ordinance creating and appointing a City Planning Board; to pass an order giving a special summer sprinkling or irrigating rate for water to domestic customers, and to do and perform any other business that might come before the body.

A resolution providing for the creation and appointing of a City Planning Board was introduced for passage and approval. Said resolution was read to the City Commission and on motion made D. A. Campbell, and seconded by W. A. Abney, it was passed unanimously by the following vote: "Ayes"- W.O. Greene, Louis Hicks, D.A. Campbell and W. A. Abney/ "Noes"- None- Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution adopted. (See another page of these for a record of said resolution)

SUMMER SPRINKLING WATER RATE.

On motion made by D.A. Campbell, seconded by Louis Hicks it was carried by a unanimous vote that a rate of \$1.50 per month minimum, which for said amount there would be allowed 5,000 gallons of water, and for all amount above that amount a charge of 30¢ per 1,000 gallons should be made, which rate shall apply to domestice users only and is for purpose of allowing more water for purpose of sprinkling or irrigating for a period beginng April 20th, 1935 and ending with October 20th, 1935.

SERVANT HOUSES EXEMPTED FROM
PAYMENT OF SEWER RENTS.

On motion duly made and carried it was ordered and directed that from and after April 1st, 1935, there shall be no charge for sewer

ADVERTISING BY USING LOUD
SPEAKERS ORDERED STOPPED.

On motion made by O. L. Hicks and seconded by W.A. Abney, it was unanimously carried that advertising by use of loud speakers from automobiles or other conveyances should be stopped and it was ordered that the City Manager see Mr. Non Binion, manager of the Pines Theatre, and request him to have such practice stopped in so far as such practice was being carried per his orders.
