MEETING OF THE CITY COMMISSION

MINUTES OF

REGULAR

- 1. The meeting was opened with prayer by Mayor Scott.
- The minutes of the regular meeting of March 19, were read 2. and approved.
- Zone change from "A" District to "G" District was granted 3. Zeke Huffman on a tract and parcel of land carried on the City Map as Tract No. 24, Map 5, and from "A" District to "E" District on a tract and parcel of land belonging to Dr. Groom Shepard on Ellis Avenue. Publication for final hearing was ordered on the application of LaReine Anderson for zone change from "A" District to "E" District on Lots Nos. 8, 9, and 10, in Block No. 3 of the W. D. Bynum Addition, such final hearing to be had on the 7th day of May, 1957. Pending final hearing applicant was granted a temporary permit to connect utilities.
- 4. The Commission approved and ordered paid the following items:

Final estimate No. 4, of the Texas Water Wells, Inc., in the sum of \$22,135.00, less \$2,000.00 retained to insure proper clean up.

Estimate No. 3, Lufkin Construction Co., in the amount of \$14,020.98.

Estimate No. 1, to Irwin Electric Co., in the sum of \$2,041.58.

Payment to Freese, Nichols & Turner in the sum of \$3,074.15, as per their statement rendered.

Estimate No. 4, Wilkes, Dake & Steed, on water contract, in the amount of \$60,421.61.

Estimate No. 6, Wilkes, Dake & Steed, on sewer contract, \$6,321.17.

- 5. The City firemen were granted permission to repair their old club house or build a new club house on the City Lake property. They were requested to designate a spot where they wanted to make such improvements. A temporary park commission composed of John D. Smith, W. N. Lively, J. O. Burnside, Mrs. Ted Trout, H. H. Stanford, Calvin Poland, and Pitser H. Garrison, was appointed to carry on the work in the improvements of the City Lake.
- 6. The City Commission accepted Starks Street dedicated to the City of Lufkin, by Commissioner Jack Nerren.
- 7. The City Commission canvassed the returns of the General Election held on the 2nd day of April, 1957, and found that for Mayor S. R. Parker, Jr., received 1218 votes, that Jim Waters received 964 votes; that S. R. Parker, Jr., having feceived a majority of all votes cast, was declared to be the duly elected Mayor for the City of Lufkin for the next 2 years; that Henry R. Lewis received 892 votes and that E. Lynn Metteauer received 1266 votes for Commissioner from Ward No. 1, that the said E. Lynn Metteauer having received a majority of the votes cast was declared to be the duly elected Commissioner from Ward No. 1, for the next two years; that W. F. (Bill) Collins received 2031 votes for Commissioner of Ward No. 3, and he was declared the duly elected Commissioner from Ward No. 3 for the next two years.
- 8. Mayor Woodrow W. Scott expressed words of appreciation for having served the people in the office of Mayor for the City of Lufkin. Dr. Granville Wright also expressed his appreciation for having served the City as Mayor in the past, and as Commissioner from Ward No. 1. He stated that he had put forth his best efforts to serve the City of Lufkin/1986 tried to treat all the people fairly and impartially.

9. There being no further business to come before the Commission, the meeting adjourned.
