MINUTES OF A CALL MEETING OF THE
CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN,
TEXAS, HELD OCTOBER 18TH, 1938.

Be it remembered that on this the 18th day of October, A.D. 1938, there was begun and holden a call meeting of the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the Municipal Office in said City, with the following officers of the City present and presiding, to-wit:

The following proceedings were had, to-wit:

C. L. Bonner and Lee Skillern were present and requested that the City Commission amend the Ordinance regulating the places within the Corporate limits where beer may be sold, and provide that sale of beer may be legal on Denman Avenue from the intersection with Homer Boulevard with said Denman Avenue to the City limits, provided the place of sale on said Denman Avenue shall not extend more than 150 feet outward from said Denman Avenue, and that sale of beer may be legal on Lots 7 and 8 of Block 1 of the North Lufkin Addition, which lots are located at the corner of Kelty Street and James Avenue. Final action on the requests as above described was deferred until a future meeting of the City Commission.

Albert Currie having made application for license to operate a Taxicab within the corporate limits of the City of Lufkin, and it appearing that proper notice of same having been made by publication as provided by ordinance, it was moved by W. D. Winston and seconded by J. E. Jay that Taxicab License be issued to the said Albert Currie upon his further compliance with the ordinance regulating the operation of Taxicabs, and the payment of the required license fee. The Mayor put the motion and it carried unanimously.

C. L. Stine, City Manager, reported the appointment of John Thomas Odom as Special Police, and requested that such appointment be confirmed by the City Commission. J.B. Perry made a motion and W.D. Winston seconded same, that such appointment be confirmed. The Mayor put the motion and it carried unanimously.
