

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF
THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY
OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, HELD
February 1st, 1921.

Be it remembered that on this the 1st day of February, A. D. 1921, there was begun and holden a regular term of the Honorable City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the Municipal Office thereof:- Present and presiding the Hon. G. A. Kelley, Mayor and S.R. Parker, Commissioner Ward No. 1, E. E. Woods, Commissioner Ward No. 2, B. L. Zeagler, Commissioner Ward No. 3 and W. B. Treadwell, Commissioner of Ward No. 4, and T. L. Dunn, City Secretary and W. O. Seale, City Attorney. City Manager, J. O. Booker was absent. The following proceedings were had to-wit:

An application or petition was made by a number of citizens, to-wit: J. S. Moore et als, praying for the installation of a water line beginning at a point where Polk Avenue intersects North First Street; thence running East with said Polk Avenue; and thence in an easterly direction by J. S. Moore's residence to a point opposite W. H. Hicks; and thence in a southerly direction to a point about opposite E. F. Dunlap's residence, the termination of same. After discussion of said petition, it was moved by Commissioner Parker and seconded by Commissioner Woods, that the City Manager make a survey of said line with a view of determining the number of feet required for said proposed line and the approximate cost of installing same, and to make report at the next regular meeting of this City Commission. The Mayor put the question before the City Commission and all members thereof voted "Aye. Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried.

It appearing to the City Commission that a number of citizens in the vicinity of Blocks Nos. 66 to 71 inclusive, are building side walks and curbs in front of their property, and that it is necessary for the construction of concrete street crossings. It was therefore moved by Commissioner Parker and seconded by Commissioner Woods, that concrete crossing be constructed across the following streets, to wit:-

Upon the question being put before the Commission, all members voted "Aye". and the Mayor declared the motion carried.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, by move and second duly made and carried, adjournment was taken.

The above minutes of the February regular term of the Honorable City Commission read and approved on this the 1st day of March, A. D. 1921.
