

MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY  
COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS,  
HELD ON JANUARY 4th, A.D. 1949 at 7:30  
O'Clock P.M.

The City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, convened in a Regular Meeting in the Regular Meeting Place in said City with the Following members present:

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1. Mr. Les Bullock and E. S. Goolsby were present in regards to getting Water, Sewer and Gas Lines, since they had been voted into the New City Limits and was on the Tax Rolls. He was advised by Mr. Early that they would get 2" Water Line before Summer. Extension

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2. A Motion was made by L. C. Martin and Seconded by C. C. Sinclair that Zone Change Application of Joe LaRue on 31/100 Acres of Land Near Two-Point on the Farm-to-Market Road from Zone "A" to Zone "C" be granted. Mayor put motion to a vote. All voted "AYE". "NOES" NONE.

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3. Mr. Early reported to the Council that the U. S. Cast Iron Pipe Foundry had advised that they would be unable to furnish the 20 Items of C.I. pipe, and requested that Order be given Trinity Foundry & Supply at an additional cost of \$900.00. Also, requested date be set February 2nd, 1949 at 2:30 P.M. for the purpose of letting contract for Water Plant Improvements. Motion was made by D. M. Thrash and seconded by G. W. Roland that order be granted Trinity Foundry & Supply Company and date for contract be set February 2nd, 1949 at 2:30 O'Clock P.M. Mayor put motion to a vote. All voted "AYE". "NOES" NONE. (Mr. Early advised that he would get in touch with Koch-Fowler in regard to date of letting of contract)

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4. Mr. Early discussed Street Paving and Water Improvements and stated that during 1947-48 that City had 847 New Connections and repaired 539 Meters and still had approximately 500 or more on flat rate. and that to buy new meters would cost \$15.05 under Old Contract price, and to get them repaired would cost approximately \$6.00. each. He was advised to order some new ones and repair old ones. The City has paved about 12,696 Ft. of paving on 15 different streets at an average cost of \$2.22 per square yard.

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5. There being no further business to come before the meeting, and on motion duly made and carried it adjourned.
