

MINUTES OF Regular MEETING OF THE CITY COMMISSION
OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, HELD July 6th
1943 AT 7:30 P.M.

On this the 6th day of July, A. D. 1943,
the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, convened in
Regular session, in the regular meeting place in said
City, with the following members thereof, to-wit:

being present, and the following absent: Arthur Temple, Jr.,
constituting a quorum when the following business was transacted:

1. Present also was Mr. A. E. Cudlipp as representative from
the Chamber of Commerce and Mr. J. B. Nabers, District Hiway
Engineer, and Lieutenant Davis of the State Defense Guard.
2. Minutes of all meetings held during the month of
June were read and regularly approved.

3. Lieutenant Davis presented a written request to the City
for use by the State Defense Guard of a part or all of the
buildings now being used by the NYA for shop, office etc.

4. The matter was discussed after which motion was made by
R. E. Melvin, second by Jas. A. Abney and carried by all members
voting yea authorizing an agreement be entered into between
the City and State Defense Guard by which the State Defense
Guard would be permitted to use one wing of the building for
the duration of the War and one month after, the part of the
building and details to be worked out by Lieutenant Davis and
City Manager Kelley.

5. Mr. Cudlipp was called on by the Mayor
and stated that he was only a visitor but complimented the
City Commission on their efforts toward taking care of the
affairs of the City and on the results that were being ac-
complished.

6. His only recommendation was to stress the efforts
for better sanitation and better recreation facilities.

7. Mr. Nabers explained to the Commission two routes the Hiway
Department had worked out for relieving the congested traffic
North and South through the City and it was agreed that surveys
would be made and an effort made to get options on easements
over both routes.

8. Mr. Kelley reported that Mr. Amos Courtney
had inquired about the prospects for opening South Second Street
to intersection with Denman Avenue and the Commission expressed
interest in opening the street provided the right-of-way could
be had on a reasonable basis.

Nothing further was offered for
attention and the meeting adjourned.
