Minutes of the City Council, Meeting June 6th, 1914.

Be it remembered that on this day, the 6th., day of June A. D. 1914, there came on and was held a "Regular" meeting of the City Council, in the Council Chambers of said City, there being present and presiding the following officers:

When the following proceedings among others were had, to-wit:

Minutes of meetings May 7th, 9th, 15th, 19th, and 23d., read passed and approved.

Report of E. E. Cochran, City Treasurer read in detail, and tabled until a future meeting, when the Council will take it up as special matter, and check same up.

Report of Committee, appointed to confer with the Eastern Texas Rail Road with reference to filling in of Herdon Street, read and approved, and committee retained until work was reported accomplished.

Report of Corporation Court read and approved, showing the following: Number cases tried six (6), fines to city \$10.00, Recorders fees \$6.00, Clerks fees \$10.20, Deputy Marshall's fees \$12.00, Attorneys Fees \$24.00, total amount collected this month \$62.20.

Report of Pound Master Seals, read and approved, showing the following: Total number of stock taken up this month 44, Total number reclaimed 43, one dying in pen. Total amount collected and turned over to City Treasurer \$40.00, Total amount of warrant to be issued to Pound Master \$40.00.

Report of Tax Assessor and Collector showing collections for month of May, read and accepted.

Report of Marshall Nerren read and approved, showing seven dogs disposed of, and secretary ordered to issue warrant on New dog fund to cover.

Report of P. A. McCarthy, City Engineer read showing results in his office during past month, and report received.

Minutes of City Council, Meeting June 6th., 1914, continued.

Official Bond of E. H. P. McMullen, Recorder with W. R. McMullen and J. M. Singleton as sureties accepted and approved, and oath of office administered by Mayor Humason.

Motion by alderman Taylor, seconded by alderman Gibson, all aldermen voting aye, that an ordinance be passed and approved, styled, "An ordinance prohibiting the tying, hitching, fastening, staking, or in any way attaching, any horse, mare, mule, jack or jennett, hog, cow, or other animal to any fence, post, or other object so as to permit said animal to graze on any sidewalk, street or other public place", and the same is hereby passed and approved.

Motion by Fairchild seconded by Gibson all aldermen voting aye that the salary of the City Engineer be set at \$125.00 per year.

Motion prevailed that a warrant for \$1500.00 favor C. M. McConnico be drawn on the New Street Improvement fund to apply on work already accomplished on the streets.

City Engineer was instructed to replace any and all monuments which has been destroyed by the installation of the sewer system.

Bills and accounts allowed as read.
