When the following proceedings among others were had, to-wit:

The purpose of the meeting as explained by the Mayor being to receive and act upon a petition presented by W. J. Glenn, et al. representing more than one hundred citizens and tax paying voters of the City of Lufkin, praying that an election be held within this City to determine whether or not the citizens should adopt and to attend to such other business as may properly come before said City Council.

give certain citizens a hearing anent the matter of bringing to grade, repairing and constructing good highways leading to each of the two lakes, (Reservoirs numbers one and two) belonging to the City of Lufkin.

After much discussion a motion was put forward and adopted that this City co-operate with the County Commissioners in constructing a graded highway on the Purcell Crossing road leading from the City of Lufkin up to the where said road intersects the A. & N. R. railroad, and that the City would then construct a road from that point to reservoir number two, and said petitioners were instructed to inform the County Commissioners that if they would bring to grade and width the said road to said point the A. & N. R. Railroad crossing, this City would keep same dragged by its street department, and in other ways help to maintain its efficiency.

There being no further business a motion was carried to adjourn.
