Dexter Satterwhite representing the Airport Advisory Committee made a report on progress of that Committee in regards to airport improvements. In this report it was recommended that Carter & Burgess engineers be empl ed to make application for Federal Aid in improving the airport. No Official Action was taken concerning the Airport was taken at this meeting. 2.

Jeff Ellis was present and asked that he be granted three Taxi Cab permit and also permission to put in a parking lot. It was pointed out that before additional Taxi Cab permits could be granted that it would be necessary to make an investigation as to the need for more Taxi Cabs in the City.

It was moved by L. C. Martin and seconded by D. M. Thrash to grant the A. & N. R. Railroad Company an easement to straighten their road bed and improve drainage along their right-of-way at the City resevoir. The motion carried by unanimous vote.

An application to change the Zone of the Clark Addition to A class low enough to permit industrial building was rejected.

It was moved by E. A. Gibbs and seconded by D. M. Thrash to grant Raymond York permission to make a brick extention to his residence on Burke Ave. The motion carried by unanimous vote.

The following Zone changes applications were approved after having been previously approved by the Zoning Board: Arthur Temple Jr--Portion of A to B.: R. B. Holleman, Portion of G to H. William H. Crain, portion of E to F.: Public hearing date was set for July 9, 1946 at 3:30 P. M.

7. A bill from the Angelina County Hospital for treatment of A. G. Havard and James Temple was rejected and ordered returned.

No further business was presented, so the meeting adjourned.
