- The Mayor announced that the meeting was held pursuant to a notice published in the Lufkin Daily News on May 11, 1941 calling a public hearing on the proposed budget for the City for the year ended March 31, 1942. The notice having been published and the proposed budget having also been published, the mayor called the meeting to order.
- John Thompson, Joe LaRue and Mr. Barge, Mr. Beaumier of the Chamber of Commerce and Tom Coleman, Jr., County Attorney. Judge Rolston and the Commissioners Court requested financial assistance from the City in order to keep the W.F.A. sewing rooms open at full capacity. Upon motion of R. E. Melvin, seconded by Cary C. Trevathan, with R. E. Melvin and Cary C. Trevathan voting "Aye", and J. E. Jay voting "Nay", it was ordered that the City provide a sum not exceeding \$500 for maintaining the sewing room, the payments to be made over a period of three months.
- In. Beaumier stated that he expected a report on the 27th from the C.A.A. in regard to the requirements for enlarging the air port, and invited the lity commission and the County Commission to the meeting for the purpose of discussing the air port improvements.
- Upon motion of Cary C. Trevathan, seconded by J.E. Jay, the City agreed to buy Lots 6 and 7, block 2 of the North Montrose Addition from Sam Townsend, Sr. for \$550.00, the purchase price to be applied on his city taxes. It was understood that Mr. Townsend was to furnish a complete abstract of title which was to be approved by the City Attorney before the deal was closed.

- Upon motion of A. E. melvin, seconded by Cary C. Trevathan, the budget for the year endergarch 31, 1942 was approved with the addition of \$4,232.65 for a 100 H.r. motor for the water well and 500.00 to supplement funds for the sewing rooms program.
- the second unit of paving program was discussed, and the council expressed the pinion that the program should be continued with concrete.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, it was, upon motion duly made and seconded, adjourned.
