Minutes of foremer meetings of the City Commission were read, and on motion duly made and carried, were approved as read.

officials of the Local Gas Distributing Company, through its officials, requested that the public hearing heretofore setchy the Gity Commission for the purpose of obtaining certain information for the purpose of determining whether or not a lower gas rate could be established in the City, be postponed to Nevember 20th, 1931 at 1:30 o'clock P.M. The request having been considered by the City it was moved by W. A. Abney and Seconded by W. O. Greene, that the request be granted. The motion having been put by the Mayor, same carried unanimously.

Attention was called to a water bill charged against H. T. Jordan, which accrued as a result of prospecting for oil at the Abney Well in the northern part of the City. Said H.T. Jordan having written a letter to the City Commission asking that same be charged off, and not collected, and it further appearing that former City Manager A. F. Daniel had authorized the water to be turned on without the necessary deposit to cover same, he having also personally agreed to see that said bill would be paid, and that he the said A.F. Daniel had since been removed from the office of City Manager of the City of Lufkin, Texas, by order of the City Commission, and he the said A.F. Daniel had not paid said bill, or made any arrangement for the payment of same, it is ordered that same be charged off and no attempt be made to collect same.

It appeared that the office of City Manager is vacant, since the removal of A.F. Daniel as City Manager, which sadd order of removal became effective October 31st, 1931, and that it is a Charter requirment that a City Manager be appointed, it was moved by C. A. Burke and seconded W. A. Abney, that T. L. Dunn, who is now City Secretary of the City of Lufkin, be appointed to said office of City Manager pending such time as may elapse before a permanent City Manager is appointed. The Mayor put the question, and the said motion carried unanimously.
