MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF
THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN,
TEXAS, HELD JUNE 6th. 1933.

Be it remembered that on this the 6th day of June A.D. 1933, there was begun and holden a regular meeting of the City Commission in and for the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the Municipal Office in said City, with the following officers of the City present and presiding, to-wit:-

The following proceedings were had, to-wit:-

Minutes of all meetings held during the month of May, were read, and on motion duly made and carried were approved as read.

All accounts and bills due by the city to various parties, firms and corporations were presented for allowance, and it appearing that those bills that have been properly approved for payment by the City Manager should be paid, it was duly moved and carried that same be paid.

T. J. Menefee and J. O. Satterwhite appeared before the City Commission relative to the matter of the said T. J. Menefee having connected his water service to that of J.O. Satterwhite's, and that since such connection he has not paid to the City water rents as provided by ordinance of the City. They explained that permission had been granted to the said T.J. Menefee by a former City Manager to so connect and it was at that time agreed that he would not have to pay the City any water rent whatsoever as a result of such connection. It appears that an amount of about \$30.00 is properly chargeable against the said T.J. Menefee for water used since having connected to the service line of the said J.O. Satterwhite, but inasmuch as permission has been secured from a city manager to make the connection, with the understanding that no charge would be made, it was moved and duly seconded and carried that the charge of \$30.00 be charged off, with the understanding that the said T.J. Menefee would disconnect his service from that of J.O. Satterwhite on or before October 1st, 1933, and run a separate service to serve his residence, which is provided by ordinance of the City.

Harry Kerr, Chief of the Fire Department appeared before the City Commission and represented to said Commission that a balance of \$24.00, expenses incident to the holding of the East Texas Firemen's Convention in Lufkin, ^{not} had been paid on account of the lack of funds, and suggested that such amount be paid by the City Commission. It was moved by W.A. Abney and seconded by C.A. Burke that such be paid. The motion carried unanimously.

The matter of final action on the matter of a petition heretofore presented asking for a reduction in telephone rates was postponed for the purpose of making further study of the question. Final action to be had at a future date of this Commission meeting.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, on motion duly made and carried it adjourned.
