MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COMMISSION
OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS HELD OCTOBER 1, 1940
AT 7:30 P. M.

The City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas convened in regular session at the regular meeting place on October 1, 1940 at 7:30 p.m. with the following members present:

and the following absent: W. D. Winston, Jr. Commissioner, Ward No. 1; constituting a quorum when the following business was had:

1. The Reverend Monroe Vivion and Reverend Alms appeared before the meeting and entered their protest against having street dances, they were speaking as a committee for the Ministers Alliance of Angelina County, Texas.

2. It was decided to set the date for the public hearing on the paving assessments for Tuesday, October 22nd at 2:00 p.m., and the proceedings upon the passage of this ordinance relating to the assessment hearing will be found immediately following these minutes, they having been placed there for purposes of convenience.

3. An ordinance was introduced establishing rules and regulations governing the Council and all people attending the assessment hearing, the proceedings had thereon being found immediately following these minutes, they having been put there for purposes of convenience.

4. The minutes of all meetings held during the month of September were read and approved.

5. Ike Turner appeared and made application for permission to erect a filling station on the corner of Keltys and Wilson Streets. Upon motion of J. E. Jay, seconded by G. E. Barington, the application was approved.

6. Mr. W. E. White, of the Texas Forest Service, presented a proposed plan for a recreation park and community forest project on the land owned by the City around Jones Lake and the City Reservoir Lake. Upon motion of G. E. Barington, seconded by J. E. Jay, the plans were tentatively approved and Mr. White and the City Manager were instructed to take such steps as necessary before final adoption.


7. Upon motion of J. E. Jay, seconded by R. E. Melvin, DeWitt Finley was employed as a policeman at \$100.00 per month, to replace Jodie Key who is to be transferred to the water department. This motion carried by the following vote:

YEAS: W. E. JAY, R. E. MELVIN, G. E. BARINGTON.


