

MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COMMISSION  
OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS HELD DECEMBER 3, 1940  
AT 7:30 P.M.

The City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas convened in regular session December 3, 1940 at 7:30 p.m. with the following members thereof present, to-wit:

and the following absent: NONE., when the following business was had:

1. The minutes of all the meetings held during the month of November were read, approved and adopted as read.

2. Mr. E. J. Conn appeared asking for action on his request for a permit for the erection of two houses at the south end of Second Street. Commissioner J. E. Jay moved that Mr. Conn be granted permits to build one house on the north and on the south side of the Charles Shirey property on South Second Street, but the motion died for the lack of a second. The matter was postponed indefinitely.

3. Mr. Underwood made a proposition to purchase the remaining 50 street improvement bonds, but no sale was made. It was decided that a meeting be called December 9th at 2:00 p.m. for purposes of raising bids.

4. Mr. Irvin, manager of the bus company, discussed the matter of bus stops and explained to the Council the need for these stops, stating that their insurance carriers required such stops.


5. The Commission decided to pay one-half of the cost of moving the garage apartment of S. A. Beckham from the alley off of Fred Street.

6. Upon motion of Commissioner W. D. Winston, Jr., seconded by Commissioner J. E. Jay, Louis Gibson was appointed as a member of the electrical examiners board. This motion carried unanimously, all commissioners voting "YEA".

7. The application of Ollie Strain to take over two taxies belonging to R. C. Deal was passed without action.

8. There being no further business to come before the meeting, it was, upon motion duly made and carried, adjourned.
