

MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COMMISSION
OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS HELD SEPTEMBER 3, 1940
AT 7:00 P.M.

The City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas convened in regular session in the regular meeting place on September 3, 1940 at 7:00 o'clock p.m. with the following members present:

Constituting a quorum when the following proceedings were had:

1. The minutes of preceding meetings were read, approved and adopted as read.
2. The application of Clifton Deal for a taxi permit for the operation of two taxicabs was read, and upon motion of Commissioner W. D. Winston, Jr., seconded by Commissioner J. E. Jay the application was granted.
3. Mr. Aubrey Jones and Mr. S. E. Castleberry appeared before the Council in behalf of securing sewage connection for Mr. Jones' house and for portions of Oak Grove Addition. The matter was carried over without any action, but the Council stated that they would investigate the matter at a later date.
4. Commissioner W. D. Winston, Jr. introduced a resolution and moved that it be placed on first reading. Seconded by Commissioner G. E. Barrington, and passed by the following vote:

The Resolution is as follows:

A RESOLUTION ORDERING THAT NOTICE BE GIVEN OF
A PUBLIC HEARING TO BE HELD IN ACCORDANCE WITH
LAW ON A PROPOSED ZONING MAP AND ORDINANCE, AND
DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas has heretofore appointed a zoning commission for the purpose of establishing a zoning map and working out a zoning ordinance for the City of Lufkin, said commission having held its public hearing in accordance with law and having made its final report to the City Commission; and,

WHEREAS the law requires that notice be published of public hearings to be held before the City Commission upon said proposed zoning ordinance and map and the immediate passage of such ordinance being important for the preservation of public peace, property, health and safety, NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS:

That the following notice be published in accordance with law in the Lufkin Daily News, a daily newspaper published in the City of Lufkin, Angelina County, Texas:

"TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

You are hereby notified that on the 2nd day of October, A.D. 1940, the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas will hold its public hearings at 7:30 p.m. at its regular meeting place in the Commission Room of the City Hall in relation to the regulation, restrictions and boundaries which have been incorporated in its proposed zoning map and ordinance. All parties in interest and citizens will be given an opportunity to be heard at said meeting."

Be it further resolved that said notice, as required by law, shall be sufficient if the above notification, signed by the Mayor and attested by the City Secretary, shall be published as aforesaid.

Be it further resolved that it is necessary for the preservation of public peace, property, health and safety that this notice be published as soon as possible, and that such necessity for immediate publication constitutes an emergency requiring that this resolution be passed and take effect immediately and as an emergency measure.
