

MINUTES OF SPECIAL MEETING OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, HELD ON THE 23RD DAY OF JUNE, 1970, AT 1:00 P. M.

On the 23rd day of June, 1970, the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, convened in special meeting in the regular meeting place of said City, with the following members thereof, to-wit:

being absent, constituting a quorum when the following business was transacted:

1. Meeting opened with prayer by LD.
2. Mayor stated special meeting was called for the purpose of canvassing returns of Special Election held on June 23, 1970, on the proposition of issuing \$3,100,000 in Sewer Revenue Bonds, and welcomed Tom Wolf of First Southwest Co., Financial Advisor to City on above issue. Canvass of returns showed following:

Taxable Property Owners

For issuance of Sewer System Revenue Bonds	739
Against issuance of Sewer System Revenue Bonds	218

Non-Property Owners

For issuance of Sewer System Revenue Bonds	74
Against issuance of Sewer System Revenue Bonds	11
Total Votes for issuance of Sewer System Revenue Bonds	813
Total Votes against issuance of Sewer System Revenue Bonds	229

BEA made motion that ordinance be passed on first and final reading declaring the above votes as official and that proposition for the issuance of Sewer System Revenue Bonds carried by a favorable majority. KRC seconded the motion and a unanimous affirmative vote was recorded.

Tom Wolf, Financial Advisor, stated that from this date and continuing for 30 days, period for contesting will be in effect.

Mayor expressed appreciation to the Lufkin News, KTRE-TV and KLUF Radio for the coverage given to the above election which he thought was of value to voters of City of Lufkin in fully understanding the proposition to be voted on.

3. There being no further business for consideration, meeting was adjourned at 1:30 P. M.
