The City Council of the City of Lufkin Texas met on this the 7th day of August 1917 in regular session with the following named officers present K. Morgan mayor presiding, S. W. Hawthorne W. D. Price, W. D. Newsom, J. A. Behannon and W. N. Coose aldermen; R. P. Walker Secretary J. S. Cochran marshal, Chas. Ellis deputy marshal and pound master, J. W. Dunn City Attorney The minutes of the last meetings were read and approved

The following named officers reports were read and approved, to wit: K. Morgan mayor, R. P. Walker Tax collector, J. S. Cochran marshal Chas. Ellis deputy marshal and pound master W. L. Jones water commissioner and R. O. Sisk Street Commissioner and also the report of W. L. Sullivan and also the report of W. L. Jones water Commissioner for the month of June 1917 was read and approved

Moved and seconded and ordered by the Council that the Secretary make Warrants # 1801 # 1802 and # 1845 paid said warrants having been issued to W. L. Jones on the 7th day of June and 4th day of July 1917 respectively aggregating the sum of \$ 263.98 and turned in by the said W. L. Jones in his report for the month of June as cash collected

Moved and seconded and so ordered that Treasurer Time warrant # - be paid amounting to \$500.00 also that the Hanover National Bank of New York be paid \$4.26 for handling Lufkin City warrants.

Moved and seconded and so ordered that the Tax collector of the City of Lufkin Texas give the St Louis Southeastern Railroad Credit on the 1916 Tax Rolls of the City for \$51.19 if the rendition as accepted by the City Board of Equalization for the year 1916 shows, or is proven to be for only \$35000 as rendered by said Railroad Company.

Moved and seconded and so ordered that all money collected from various parties on fishing permits be placed in the water works operating fund.

Moved and seconded and so ordered that the mayor have the Fire alarm whistle at the Lufkin Light & Power Company plant, repaired and placed in good condition so that fire alarms can be given with same.

Moved and seconded and so ordered that Shup Townsends offer of a settlement for water consumed upto date be accepted.

Moved and seconded and so ordered that the purchase of a horse to take the place of one that got killed be referred to the Street and Alley Committee. Motion prevailed to adjourn till Friday August 10th 1917.
