the following business was transacted:

1. Meeting opened with prayer by Captain Cecil Brown of the Salvation Army who left immediately due to other commitments. Mayor Waters expressed appreciation to Captain Brown for his presence and for giving the invocation.

- 2. Mayor Waters stated that this special meeting had been called for the purpose of opening bids on Construction of the East Side Sewer Line. He welcomed all visitors present in connection with the opening of these bids.
- 3. The City Manager stated that one Company, Joe C. Norman Construction Company of Orange, Texas, did not get its bid in before the 5:00 P.M. deadline as specified in the bid advertisement, being about 15 minutes late. However, Mr. Norman who was present, would like to have his bid considered if the City Commission would allow same. The City Attorney stated it would be satisfactory if the other bidders had no objection and the City Commission approved. Mayor Waters inquired of those present if they objected to honoring this bid. No objections were voiced. Commissioner E.K. Shirey made a motion that same be accepted, since no objections were voiced. Commissioner Bayo Hopper seconded the motion, and the vote was unanimous.
- 4. The City Manager opened the bids, assisted by Mr. R.E.L. Johnson of Collie and Turner, Consulting Engineers, Houston, Texas, and same are listed below the necessary bid bonds and financial information accompanying the bids:

Mr. R.E.L. Johnson stated he would check the figures in all bids over in detail and then tabulate the list of bids with recommendation to City Commission on awarding of contract, subject to the approval of the State Health Department and the U.S. Public Health Service. Also bid bonds should be returned to all bidders, with the exception of the three lowest bidders, and if the City Commission so desired he would handle this matter after the bids had been checked and three lowest bidders determined officially. Commissioner Bayo Hopper made motion that Mr. R.E.L. Johnson be authorized to handle this detail. Commissioner E.K. Shirey seconded the motion, and the vote was unanimous.

Mr. R.E.L. Johnson stated that he would make a detailed study of the remaining funds available for other work before making recommendation on advertising for bids for such additional work.
