said City, with the following members thereof, to-wit:

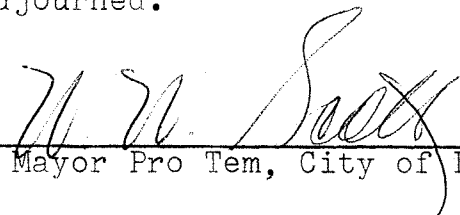

Mayor, constituting a quorum when the follow-
ing business was transacted:

1. The meeting was opened with a prayer by Mayor Pro Tem W. L. Collins.
2. The minutes of the regular meeting held on August 2nd. were read and approved.
3. Mrs. R. B. Bledsoe came before the Commission and protested the opening of a street which she claimed encroached on her property. The City informed her that it had no intention of taking any portion of her property, and the City Attorney and the City Manager were requested to work out the matter with Mrs. Bledsoe at the earliest convenience.
4. Bids were opened for improvements on certain streets of the City, and Moore Bros. Construction Company, being the lowest and best bidders, on both projects as previously advertised, such contracts were awarded to Moore Bros. Construction Company.
5. Bob Day reported for Rauscher-Pierce Bonding Company that all outstanding water and sewer bonds of the City of Lufkin had been accounted for and were available to be repurchased. Bond election to determine whether or not the City would vote water and sewer bonds, was set for September 15th, 1955, and the following were named as election judges and clerks: Etra Barrington, Lynn Durham, J. S. Cauthen, and Mrs. Cleo L. Green.

6. Bills for the month of July were approved and ordered paid.

7. There being no further business to come before the Commission, the meeting was adjourned.
