

MINUTES OF A CALL MEETING OF THE  
CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN,  
TEXAS, HELD September 21st, 1937.

Be it remembered that on this the 21st day of September A.D. 1937, there was begun and holden a call meeting of the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the Municipal Office in said City with the following officers of the City present and presiding, to-wit:

W. M. Glenn,	Mayor,
W. D. Winston, Jr,	Coms. Ward No. 1,
Lewis Hicks,	Coms. Ward No. 2,
J. B. Perry,	Coms. Ward No. 3,
J. E. Jay,	Coms. Ward No. 4,

T. L. Dunn,	City Secretary and Acting City Manager.

The following proceedings were had, to-wit:-

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The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the question of providing office space for an Area Office of the Works Progress Administration to be located in Lufkin. The matter was thoroughly discussed after which it was moved by J. B. Perry and seconded by W. D. Winston, Jr that the City of Lufkin pay one-half of the cost for rent for such an office (rent only) including utility bills, except telephone, on condition that the County of Angelina pay the other one-half. The motion was put by the Mayor and it carried unanimously.

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A resolution entitled "RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, AUTHORIZING W.M.GLENN, MAYOR, TO EXECUTE A LEASE FOR THE CITY OF LUFKIN, LEASING TO J. D. MARTIN 39½ ACRES OF LAND, A PART OF THE A. VAREALA LEAGUE, KNOWN AS THE JONES LAKE PROPERTY, FOR A TERM OF ONE YEAR, FOR THE CONSIDERATION OF ONE HUNDRED TWENTY FIVE & NO/100 (\$25.00) DOLLARS"

was introduced for passage and approval. Same having been read to the City Commission, it was moved by Lewis Hicks and seconded by J. E. Jay that said resolution be passed and approved. The Mayor put the question and the following is the recorded vote on the motion."AYES W.M.Glenn, W.D.Winston, Jr. Lewis Hicks, J. B. Perry and J. E. Jay. "NOES"- None. Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution passed and approved.

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There came up for discussion the matter of doing something about the operation of a Bus Station on First Street, especially at the location it is now using. It was the opinion, expressed by each member of the City Commission, that a different location be secured for a bus station, otherwise necessary ordinances should be passed and enforced looking to the interest of the public along the line of public safety and convenience. The City Attorney was instructed to write the Bus Company or Bus Station advising them of the intention of the City Commission.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, on motion  
duly made and carried, it adjourned.
