MINUTES OF Called MEETING OF THE CITY COMMISSION

1944 AT 3:30 P.M.

constituting a quorum when the following business was transacted:

1. July bills amounting to \$3,041.56 was presented for approval, and on motion by Arthur Temple, Jr. second by D. M. Thrash, and carried by all members voting yes, were approved for payment.
2. Discussion of the property at the intersection of Herndon and Dozier streets was brought up. After which a motion was made by D. M. Thrash, second by B. F. Milligen and carried by all members voting yes, that in as much as this property was deeded to the City for street purposes only, and it appearing that there is no need for the property that is not now used by the street, would be released to the railroad company with the exception of 10 feet on each street at the intersection, which is retained for protection of Traffic at this point.
3. Mr. Lewis reported communication from Mr. John Redditt, who is Chairman of the Highway Committee of the Chamber of Commerce, that the City pass a resolution requesting the State Highway Dep't to make a study of the Highway needs of Lufkin, and prepare a Master Highway plan for Lufkin and surrounding territory.
4. The matter was thoroughly discussed but action deferred since a plan for Highway 59 Loop through the City, prepared by the Highway Dep't. has already been approved by the City Commission, and is waiting approval by the State Highway Dep't and they want to be sure and not disturb this plan.

No further business was presented and the meeting was closed.
