MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING OF
THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN,
TEXAS, HEED August 2, 1938.

Be it remembered that on this the 2nd day of August, A. D. 1938, there was begun and holden a regular meeting of the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the Municipal Office in said City with the following officers of the City present and presiding, to-wit:

The following proceedings were had, to-wit:-

The Y.M.C.A. Committee composed of H. E. Rogers, E. L. Corson and E.W. Leach were present and made request that the City of Lufkin provide site on which to construct a Y.M.C.A. building. A site located at the North side of the present City Park was suggested, but no decision was made as to whether or not it would be suitable and action was deferred until grounds Committee of the Y.M.C.A. and representatives of the City could look the situation over and make report to the City Commission later.

It appearing that heretofore the City Manager had appointed Henry Finley, Park Attendant, Special Officer with duties to be performed at the City Park, and such other duties as he might be called upon to perform, and it appearing that it is a Charter requirement that such appointment be confirmed by the City Commission, W. D. Winston, made a motion that said appointment be confirmed, which said motion was seconded by J. B. Perry. The Mayor put the motion and the following is the recorded vote on same: "AYES"- W.M.Glenn, W.D.Winston, Lewis Hicks, J. B. Perry and J. E. Jay. "NOES"- None Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried and the appointment confirmed.

An Ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN AMENDING AN ORDINANCE KNOWN AS "THE TAXI CAB ORDINANCE", WHICH WAS PASSED AND ADOPTED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN ON THE 14th DAY OF JUNE, A.D. 1937, PROVIDING FOR THE LICENSING AND REGULATION OF TAXI CABS, AND PROVIDING FOR THE LICENSING OF CHAUFFEURS, BY ADDING THERETO CERTAIN SECTIONS, AND PROVIDING A SAVING CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY"

was introduced for passage on second and final reading. The matter being discussed, it was moved by Commissioner J. B. Perry that said Ordinance be placed on second and final reading and that it be passed and approved on second and final reading. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Lewis Hicks. The Mayor put the question and the following is the recorded vote

on the motion: "AYES"- W. M. Glenn, W. D. Winston, Lewis Hicks, J. B. Perrey and J. E. Jay. "NOES" - None. Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried and the ordinance passed and approved on second and final reading. (See another page of these minutes for a record of the ordinance)

The matter of construction a Municipal Swimming pool was discussed; the need of such swimming pool; how it could be financed; the possibilities of a Government Grant and whether or not such a project would be self liquidating. After considerable discussion, the City Manager was instructed to make some investigation along all these lines and report back to the City Commission at a later meeting.

City Manager C. L. Stine gave an outline of work he contemplates getting under way soon, and some ~~of~~ of the things mention were: Painting trash cans in the business district; painting the light standards; painting the Fire Hydrants and Fire Alarm Boxes; grading all dirt streets and all alleys where possible; cleaning up at the Incinerator; cutting of weeds in Alleys and on all public property and having the Police Department start work on a "Safety" move for purpose of making it more safe for school children, inasmuch as School will soon open and also to make driving safe for every one. Also to remove driving hazards that exist at Street intersections in several parts of the city.

There being no further business to come before the meeting on move and second duly made and carried it adjourned.
