Ordinance No. 10
The City Council of the City of Lufkin, Texas, do hereby enact and ordain that
it be unlawful for any person to enter upon or into the New City Reservoir
which said reservoir is located on a portion of the A. Barrella
league of land in Angelina County, Texas, same being blocks
eleven and twelve of the A. M. Dennis' subdivision of said
Barrella league, for the purpose
of bathing, boating, swimming
or for any other purpose unless
duly authorized by the City
Council of the city of Lufkin,
Texas. Any person violating
the provisions of this ordinance
shall be deemed guilty of a mis-
demeanor and upon a conviction
therefor shall be fined in any
sum not less than five dollars
(\$5.00) nor more than one hun-
dred dollars (\$100.00).

Motion carried that the City Attorney be instructed to ask the Lufkin Light Co. and the Lufkin Telephone Co. to have placed their guy wires, enclosed in a painted wooden box for the safety of pedestrians traveling at night.

Motion carried that the Mayor and Secretary purchase and have charged to the City of Lufkin, furniture and equipment for the new City Hall, preparatory for occupancy at once.

Motion carried that special permission be granted the States Jurisdiction, the Texas-Banner Oil Co. and the Gulf Refining Co. to erect within the city limits, and outside of the Brick Fire limits, iron clad buildings for the storage of their oils, such as Gasoline, engine kerosene, Lubricating & illuminating oils.

Books and acc'ts allowed as per pages 42 & 43 minutes of acc'ts.

Motion carried to adjourn.
