MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING
OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF THE
CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS, HELD
May 3rd, 1938.

Be it remembered that on this the 3rd day of May, A.D. 1938 there was begun and holden a regular meeting of the City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the Municipal Office in said City with the following officers of the City present and presiding, to-wit:

The following proceedings were had, to-wit:

Minutes of all meetings held during the month of April 1938, were read and on motion duly made and carried were approved as read.

Mrs. Jno. Cook and Mrs. Clara Floyd were present and Mrs. Cook made an appeal to the City Commission for help on her salary as Case Worker for Angelina County Relief Board. Her plea was listended to, and many questions were asked regarding her work, and she was promised that consideration would be given to the matter. No action taken.

Mr. E. V. Cromwell was present before the City Commission and made a talk in support of the City installing Sanitary Drinking Fountains at suitable places in the business district of the City, he giving as a reason for doing so that places like his, (a drug store) was made headquarters for getting ice water, and that he felt like it was more or less an imposition on him and others similarly situated. His argument was listened to and the question was discussed, but was passed without action.

Mr. T. J. Mankin was present and suggested that something should be done to protect the Air Port from washing, and made the suggestion that in his opinion some sodding could be done without much expense. He was informed that it was the plan of the City Commission to make an effort to have WPA do some sodding ong the fi&ed at the time they return to build the road from Highway No. 40 to the Air Port sight. No further action was taken.

Mr. Ray Roberts, representing the NYA was present and made a talk in behalf of the setting up of a NYA project for girls and young women who are eligible for such work, and asked the City to sponsor such a project. After due and deliberate consideration of the matter, it was moved by W.D.Winston J.

and seconded by J. E. Jay that the City sponsor such a project and to permit the use of the old J.E. Wilson Building on Denman Avenue, on condition that that the County pay to the City the sum of \$25.00 per month, representing one-half of the rental value of the property and to also pay one-half of all utility bills. The City not to be put to any expense whatsoever, except the furnishing one-half the rental value of the building and one-half of the utility bills. The mayor put the question and it carried unanimously.

An Ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE MAKING MANDATORY THE GRADING AND LABELLING OF MILK AND CERTAIN MILK PRODUCTS SOLD OR OFFERED FOR SALE WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN, TEXAS; PROHIBITING THE SALE OF ADULTERATED, MISBRANDED, OR UNGRADED MILK, AND MILK PRODUCTS^{1/2} REQUIRING AND PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUING AND REVOKING OF PERMITS ~~FOR~~ FOR THE SALE OF MILK AND MILK PRODUCTS; AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE CITY HEALTH OFFICER TO RECEIVE APPLICATIONS FOR, INSPECT DAIRIES AND MILK PLANTS AND GRANT OR REVOKE PERMITS TO PERSONS, FIRMS AND CORPORATIONS TO SELL OR OFFER FOR SALE GRADED MILK AND MILK PRODUCTS WITHIN THE CITY; PROVIDING FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF FUTURE DAIRIES AND MILK PLANTS; ADOPTING THE PROVISIONS OF ~~THE~~ SENATE BILL 83 PASSED BY THE REGULAR SESSION OF THE 45TH LEGISLATURE, 1937; PROVIDING FOR THE ENFORCEMENT OF THIS ORDINANCE, AND THE FIXING OF PENALTIES" was introduced for passage and approval on

second and final reading. J. B. Perry made a motion that said ordinance be placed on second and final reading and that it be passed and approved on second and final reading. J. E. Jay seconded the motion. The Mayor put the question and the following is the recorded vote on the motion. "AYES"- W.M. Glenn, W.D. Winston, Jr., Lewis Hicks, J. B. Perry and J. E. Jay. "NOES"- None - Whereupon the Mayor declared the motion carried and the ordinance passed and approved on final reading. (See another page of these minutes for a record of the ordinance)

AIRPORT RENTAL.

J. B. Perry made a motion that a rental charge of \$5.00 per month per ship be charged to parties who kept at the Airport regularly. The motion was seconded by Lewis Hicks. The Mayor put the question and it carried unanimously.

FISHING PERMITS.

It was moved by Lewis Hicks and seconded by J. E. Jay that the rates for fishing licenses or privileges at the City Reservoir be fixed as follows: Season permits: Single, \$6.00; Family including man and wife and single children to age sixteen and who reside with their parents, \$10.00. For one day fishing, .50 cents per person. The motion carried unanimously.

PIT AND DRY PRIVIES.

It was moved by J. E. Jay and seconded by Lewis Hicks, that all persons,

the territory embraced within one block of the Fire Limits of the City
be required to remove same, and if any toilet facilities are maintained on
the premises, sanitary water closets shall be installed, and further that
a time limit of 60 days shall be given in which to comply with this order.
The Mayor put the question and it carried unanimously. 91


All accounts and bills due by the City to various parties, firms and
