The City council of the city of Lufkin met in call session according to the call of the Mayor for the purpose of canvassing the ^{and declaring the} result of the recent election held on April 3rd for the election of city officers: Those present and participating were Mayor Shearer W.D.Price, T.W.Largent ^{Revised} and C.A.Burke Aldermen; ^{at the University City Building & P. Office} After carefully canvassing the vote as returned by the presiding officer of said election the council found that there were 164 votes cast in said election and the following named persons received the number of votes set opposite their names for their respective offices:

For Aldermen

G.A. Medford Revised 151 ¹ votes

T.W.Largent received 160 votes

For Treasurer,

W.M.Glenn received 162 votes

For Secretary C

C.N.Humason received 163 votes

For Assessor & Collector

D.J.Campbell received 48 votes

G.A.Medford received 114 votes

There being two aldermen to elect and it being shown that said T.W.Largent and W.D.Price each received a majority of the votes cast at said election they were declared duly elected as aldermen for the ensuing two years.

W.M.Glenn having received a majority of the votes cast at said election was duly declared elected to the office of City Treasurer for the ensuing two years and he was ordered to give a good and sufficient bond payable to the Mayor or his successors in the sum of \$ 8000⁰⁰ / 100.

C.N.Humason having received a majority of all votes cast at said election was duly declared elected to the office of City Sec. and ordered to give bond in the sum of \$ 500⁰⁰.

It having been ascertained that G.A.Medford received a majority of all votes cast at said election he having received 114 and D.JL Campbell having only received 48 he the said Medford was duly de-

clared elected to the office of city assessor and collector for the
ensuing two years and ordered to give bond in the sum of \$3000⁰⁰
payable to the Mayor and to his successors in office.
