REGULAR MEETINGOF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITYOF LUFKIN, TEXAS, HELD MARCH 1st, 1921.

Be it remembered that on this the 1st day of March, A. D. 1921, there was begun and holden a regular term of the Honorable City Commission of the City of Lufkin, Texas, at the Municipal Office thereof; Present and presiding the Hon. G. A. Kelley, Mayor, S. R. Parker, Commissioner of Ward No. 1, E. E. Woods, Commissioner of Ward No. 2, B. L. Zeagler, Commissioner of Ward No. 3 and W. B. Treadwell, Commissioner of Ward No. 4, J. O. Booker, City Manager, W. O. Seale, City Attorney and T. L. Dunn, City Secretary, when the following proceedings were had to-wit:-

Minutes of former meetings of the City Commission, read, and by move and second duly made and carried, were adopted.

An Ordinance calling an Election to be held on the 5th day of April, A.D.1921, was presented for passage and approval, which election is to be held for the purpose of electing a Mayor and four Commissioners for the City of Lufkin, Texas, for the ensuing two years. Motion was made by E. E. Woods, and same was seconded by S. R. Parker, that said ordinance be passed and approved. Same being put to a vote of the Commission, same unanimously carried.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LUFKIN:

That the City of Lufkin accept from Mr. L. S. Atkins, deed convey-ing a strip of land fifty feet wide and 1072 feet long adjoining the Texas Southeastern Railroad right-of-way on South and Southeast in the Northwestern portion of the city, to be used for Street purposes.

And the Mayor, Hon. G. A. Kelley, is hereby authorized to execute deed for the City of Lufkin to said L. S. Atkins conveying portions of Branch and Second Streets as shown on the plat of the Angelina County Lumber Company's Addition to said City, same being in exchange for the strip above described, and fully described in Engineer's Report.

Motion was made by E. E. Woods and same was seconded by S. R. Parker that the above resolution be passed and approved. Same having been submitted by vote to the City Commission, same carried unanimousty.
