LUFKIN, TEXAS, HELD AUGUST 19th,
1938.

The meeting was for the purpose of hearing representatives from Moroney and Company of Houston and Mahan, Dittmar & Co of San Antonio, and to consider the matter of selling a proposed issue of \$150,000.00 Water and Sewer Revenue Bonds to said Moroney & Co and Mahan, Dittmar & Co.,

After considerable discussion of the matter it was decided to defer action until 1:30 o'clock P.M.

At 1:30 o'clock P.M. the Commission re-convened and a written proposition signed by Moroney & Company of Houston, by Robt. E. Moroney, and by Mahan, Dittmar & Co of San Antonio, by R. R. Rowls, was presented to the City Commission for consideration.

After duly considering same, it was moved by W. D. Winston, and seconded by J. B. Perry that the proposition as aforesaid be accepted. The Mayor put the question and the following is the recorded vote on the motion: "AYES"- W. M. Glenn, W. D. Winston, Lewis Hicks, J. B. Perry and J. E. Jay.
