constituting a quorum when the following business was transacted;

1. Arthur Temple, Jr. made a report for the Committee appointed to investigate possibilities for the swimming pool, which included a proposition from Paddock Engineering Company of Dallas, to make plans and specifications for the type and size pool that is considered adequate for Lufkin, Texas.
2. His report was of a proposition from The Lufkin Fdy, and Machine Company, to give 19 acres of land, a part of the Harrell property on the Old Diboll Highway for a park and swimming pool, provided the City would erect a cyclone fence along the dividing line between this land and that retained by the Foundry, and that the City extend the present concrete storm sewer on through their property.
3. D. M. Thrash also presented a proposition on another tract of land, and on motion of Arthur Temple, Jr., second by B. F. Milligan and carried by all members voting yes, this committee was authorized to secure an option on a tract of land, if they could find one they consider suitable, and if the price is attractive.

There was no further business presented and the meeting was adjourned.
